Course synopsis (max. 10 lines) _____

Basic course on cataract surgery and refractive surgery for young ophthalmologists during their training. This one-day course will cover all stages of cataract surgery on the level for the learning young surgeon starting surgery. This will encompass the basic steps of surgery and the possible complications of each of the steps as well as approaches to deal with these. A renowned international panel experienced in cataract surgery teaching will cover different strategies of approaching difficult cases in daily practice. The course also touches on the basics of refractive surgery mainly relevant to cataract surgery. (see added list for more details).

Aim(s) of the course (max. 10 lines) _____

Introduce basic knowledge concerning mainly cataract but also refractive surgical aspects relevant to lens surgery for residents.

To keep the course interactive and didactic, two speakers will co-present each topic. This will allow not only the different viewpoints on the approaches to teaching, but also invite for vivid discussion with the auditorium as well as the chairing panel. Plenty of time is planned for discussion between the audience and the speakers on this day.

Achievements (what will the participant achieve in knowledge) _____

The participant will achieve a thorough knowledge of the basics needed before engaging into surgery during or shortly after the training. Due to the open and constructive discussion which is moderated by the panel and the speakers, a balanced but clear and distinct approach to the topic will be discernable. Video-presentations within the talks will illustrate the content being transferred.
