This course is a comprehensive overview of all aspects of contemporary cataract surgery. It covers aspects of how to train/teach cataract surgery and how to gain the most from such teaching. It covers basic aspects of doing cataract surgery including managing the capsule and the physics and machine parameters of phakoemulsification. The course also includes more advanced aspects of cataract surgery including complex cases, managing complications and using special intraocular lenses.

The international faculty are recognised experts in cataract surgery from many countries of Europe.

1. The course is aimed at ophthalmic surgeons training in cataract surgery and their trainers
2. To provide an understanding of basic aspects of cataract surgery including capsule management and phakodynamics

4. To provide an overview of the indications and techniques for the use of special intraocular lens.
5. To inform the participants on the management of complications
6. The outcome of the course is raised awareness of training techniques in cataract surgery, better understanding of phako-dynamics and increased confidence in managing complex cases
